OUR HISTORY

- 1860** The first Public Assistance groups were founded
- 1904** In Naples, the National Federation was founded
- 1911** the Federation received official recognition as a Non-profit organization devoted to Public Interest
- 1930** King's Decree 1.04 dissolved the Public Assistance groups, and their responsibilities and assets were absorbed by the Italian Red Cross
- 1946** The first Medical Congress of the Federation took place in Milan
- 1987** at the Congress of Terni, a new Statute was passed thus establishing Anpas
- 1997** the Congress of Rome approved the new Statute establishing the autonomy of the regional Chapters

Anpas activities are carried out by volunteers of the Governing Bodies with the support of an operative structure composed of 14 employees in 2012.

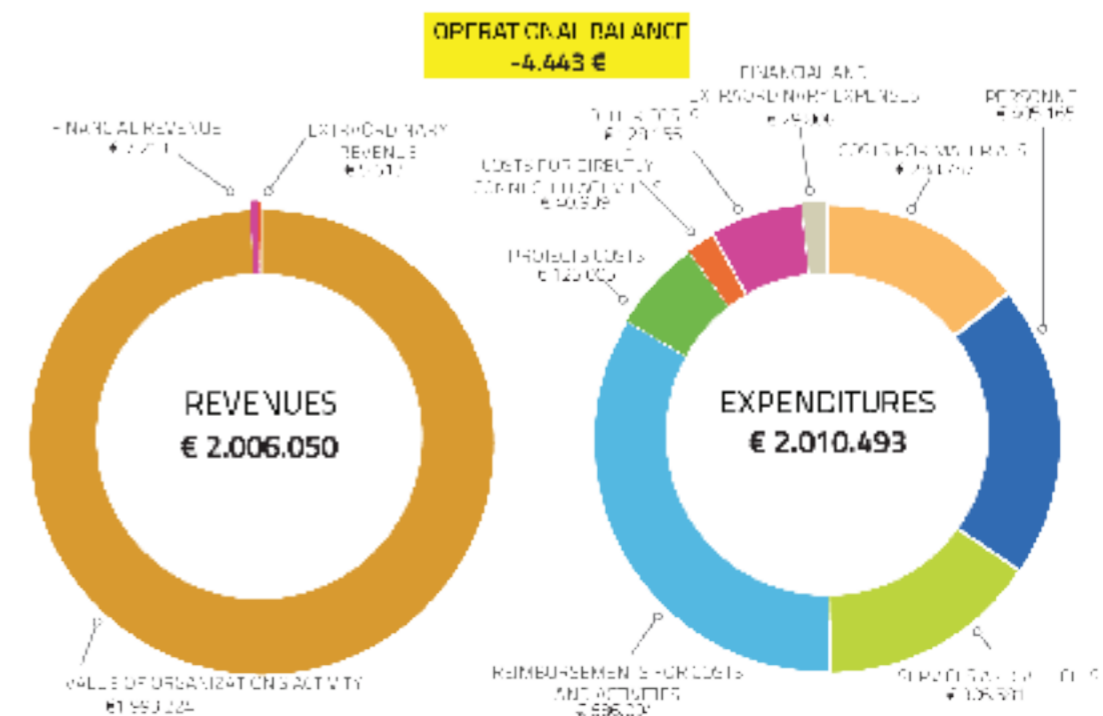
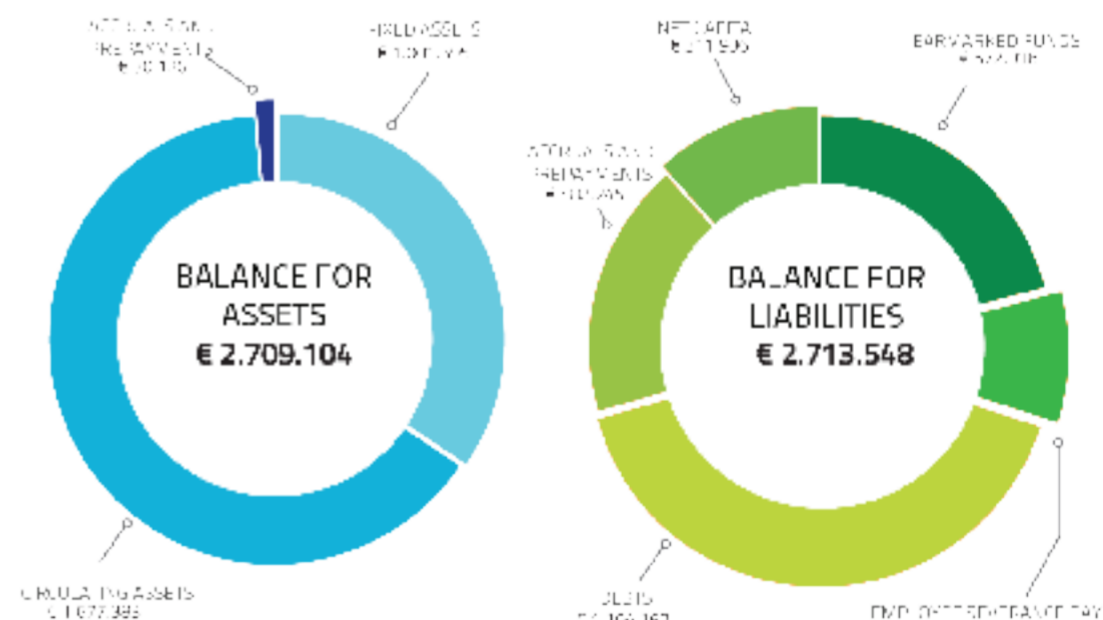

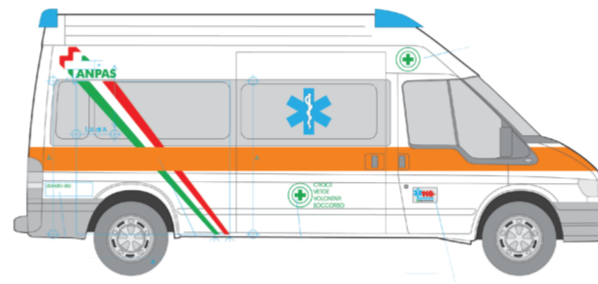

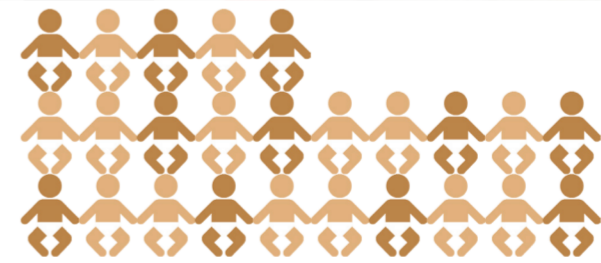

Volunteers Operating in the Aftermath of the 2012 Emilia Romagna Earthquake in Italy

Immediately following the earthquake, Anpas was involved in the recovery efforts, running two IDPs camps at Mirandola and Novi di Modena, where the engagement was considerable: 2.137 volunteers were involved in 153 days on duty and 126.471 hours of volunteering. 15 volunteers in dog-units, 207 volunteers involved in field cooking, 47 volunteers involved in camps management and coordinating at national level, 73 volunteers for electric and plumbing system and for warehouse 1261 volunteers for logistics activities, 165 doctors, nurses, first-aiders 228 volunteers in emergency secretariat (camp and central coordination post), 141 volunteers for psycho-social care (psychologists, educators, entertainers)
